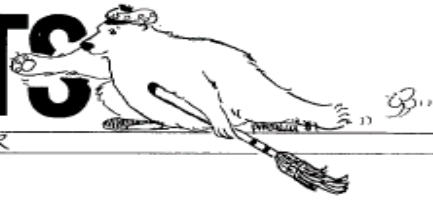

Format: Teams of 4, Scramble, 9 holes

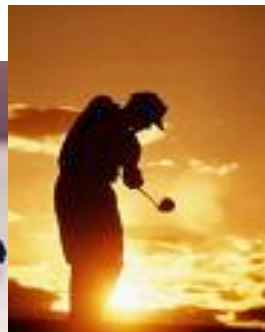
